Details for attendance in school

- Children will be in non-uniform PLEASE NOTE children will be physically active during each school day with Forest School items required for Monday and Fridays. If children prefer routine then the Water PE kit or uniform is also fine. Anything which makes your life easier, we are happy with.
- Rossendale Leisure Trust will be offering support on Monday and Friday Lunchtimes
- School lunches will be provided by LCC catering.
- Water and snacks will be provided by school there is no need for the children to bring anything into school.

Details for Home Learning

- Over the next two days activities will be posted on SeeSaw for the children to complete
- The majority of learning packs are now complete. These will last for two weeks and contain Maths, English, Topic tasks. Details can be found on the website. Teachers will also be posting daily videos which can be found through SeeSaw and Dojo.
- Collection times for packs will be sent out tomorrow. Please make every effort to collect these. As a school we have spent a lot of effort and time in preparing these for your child. If you are struggling to collect please let school or your teachers know and we will arrange drop offs to your location.
- A weekly zoom PSHE session will also be delivered by your teachers.

# **Critical workers**

Parents whose work is critical to the coronavirus (COVID-19) and EU transition response include those who work in health and social care and in other key sectors outlined in the following sections.

#### Health and social care

This includes, but is not limited to, doctors, nurses, midwives, paramedics, social workers, care workers, and other frontline health and social care staff including volunteers; the support and specialist staff required to maintain the UK's health and social care sector; those working as part of the health and social care supply chain, including producers and distributors of medicines and medical and personal protective equipment.

#### **Education and childcare**

This includes:

- childcare
- support and teaching staff
- social workers
- specialist education professionals who must remain active during the coronavirus (COVID-19) response to deliver this approach

## **Key public services**

This includes:

- those essential to the running of the justice system
- religious staff
- charities and workers delivering key frontline services





- those responsible for the management of the deceased
- journalists and broadcasters who are providing public service broadcasting

#### Local and national government

This only includes those administrative occupations essential to the effective delivery of:

- the coronavirus (COVID-19) response, and the delivery of and response to EU transition
- essential public services, such as the payment of benefits and the certification or checking of goods for import and export (including animal products, animals, plants and food), including in government agencies and arms length bodies

## Food and other necessary goods

This includes those involved in food:

- production
- processing
- distribution
- sale and delivery
- as well as those essential to the provision of other key goods (for example hygienic and veterinary medicines)

#### Public safety and national security







- police and support staff
- Ministry of Defence civilians
- contractor and armed forces personnel (those critical to the delivery of key defence and national security outputs and essential to the response to the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak and EU transition)
- fire and rescue service employees (including support staff)
- National Crime Agency staff
- those maintaining border security, prison and probation staff and other national security roles, including those overseas

#### **Transport and border**

This includes those who will keep the air, water, road and rail passenger and freight transport modes operating during the coronavirus (COVID-19) response and EU transition, including those working on transport systems through which supply chains pass and those constructing or supporting the operation of critical transport and border infrastructure through which supply chains pass.

#### Utilities, communication and financial services

This includes:

- staff needed for essential financial services provision (including but not limited to workers in banks, building societies and financial market infrastructure)
- the oil, gas, electricity and water sectors (including sewerage)
- information technology and data infrastructure sector and primary industry supplies to continue during the coronavirus (COVID-19) response
- key staff working in the civil nuclear, chemicals, telecommunications (including but not limited to network operations, field engineering, call centre staff, IT and data infrastructure, 999 and 111 critical services)
- postal services and delivery
- payments providers
- waste disposal sectors
