## Water Primary School Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure



At Water Primary School, children are at the centre of everything we do.

We aim to give our children the best possible opportunities and learning experiences, enabling them to reach their full potential. We aim to ensure that the children in our care are equipped for life-long learning as responsible citizens in an ever-changing, diverse community.

#### Context

Water Primary School is a small school, with 125 (current) children on roll, from reception to year 6. The school serves the small village of Water, which is a close community. We are determined as a school to ensure that that our children are given every opportunity and chance to succeed and realise their full potential. We are committed to make a difference to every child in our care, regardless of background. The difference between success and failure is the willingness to aim high, learn from mistakes and to have the passion and commitment to learn and acquire knowledge. The vision and ethos of the school is to embed a culture of life long learning in all of our children. Pupil premium funding is integral to this culture and vision. This policy outlines how we will ensure it is spent to maximum effect.

27 % of our children are eligible for FSM including Ever 6 Children. 11 % of children have SEN support of which three children have a EHC Plan (3%)

#### **Recent initiatives and improvements**

- Increased attainment and progress across the school
- Rising roll December 13 we had 56 children on roll. In September 2018 we have 125 children.
- Excellent engagement parents through the use of social media, events and parent forums.
- Termly mentoring sessions for each child so children are able to talk confidently about where they are and know what the next steps for improvement are.
- New ICT infrastructure
- New school website which promotes learning and parental engagement.
- Development of middle leaders throughout the school
- Extensive CPD linked to school development
- Increased sports provision and after school club activities
- Healthy Breakfast Club Change 4life activities daily and healthy menus and choices
- Improvement in Outdoor learning spaces including growing areas.
- Forest School

#### **Objectives**

It is important that when decisions regarding the allocation of the pupil premium funding are made, the context and the challenges of the school are considered. In addition, it is vital that range of sources are included when determining those contexts and challenges.

Common barriers for FSM children can be less support at home, weak language and communication skills, lack of confidence, more frequent behaviour difficulties, and attendance and punctuality issues. Complex family situations may also prevent children from flourishing.

It is our key objective to narrow the gap between pupil groups. Through targeted interventions, projects and initiatives we are working and developing ways of reducing and eliminating barriers to learning and progress. Through robust policies, assessment and procedures we must ensure children who start school with low attainment make accelerated progress In order to achieve age related expectations and beyond.
